Treasury's Communications Unit does not provide direct services to Ministers or Parliamentary Secretaries. The role of Communications Unit is to provide communications advice and to support Treasury's responsibilities. The Unit's core functions are as follows:

 Provision of media and parliamentary monitoring and reporting services, including the production of a daily media summary and question time summaries

- Development and implementation of communication strategies to support internal communications and also external communication to support government initiatives
- Event management support for small and large-scale events (e.g. the 2011 Tax Forum)
- Communication support for the annual Budget process, including managing the production of whole of government media releases and associated briefings and facilitating media access to officials during the annual Budget lock-up
