- 3. Can you provide details of representations to the Minister and/or the department on this matter from other people and organisations, since 2000?
- 4. How many times has the Government been lobbied on this matter since 2000?
- 5. What has been the Government's response, until now? Has it approached state and territory ministers, urging them to grant transport concessions to international students? Please provide details and copies of any relevant correspondence.

Public transport concession fares for international students

I am writing to you in response to representations made to me by the Malaysian Minister for Education regarding the decision made by your Government to continue to charge full fares to international students travelling on public transport.

International education plays a crucial role in Australia's engagement with the world. International education also provides significant social, cultural and intellectual benefits as well as economic benefits to Victoria and Australia more broadly. In 2005, international education contributed approximately \$2.9 billion to the Victorian economy.

As you may be aware, a recent ruling of the New South Wales Administrative Decisions Tribunal (ADT) held that the New South Wales Government is discriminating against international students based on their country of origin by denying them access to concession fares on public transport. The ruling of the ADT has resulted in a level of negative coverage that could adversely affect Australia's international education industry, particularly as international students do not necessarily understand the distinction between States in Australia's federal system of government. I understand that a similar claim has also been lodged with the Victorian Equal Opportunity Commission.

Australia's international education industry contributed \$10 billion to the economy in 2005. It is in the best interests of this industry that all levels of government work together to ensure that Australia is the most attractive location for international students regardless of their final destination incountry. Accordingly, I strongly encourage you to re-evaluate your Government's policy on the availability of concession fares on public transport for international students.


