PRODUCTIVITY PLACES

- 1. Are all states and territories still offering Productivity Places?
- 2. What was the Commonwealth expenditure on Productivity Places for the 2009/10 financial year?
- 3. What is the predicted Commonwealth expenditure for the 2010/11 financial year? How many places have been offered (with a breakdown by state and territory) in the last 12 months?

Answer

1. Are all states and territories still offering Productivity Places?

Yes.

2. What was the Commonwealth expenditure on Productivity Places for the 2009/10 financial year?

In 2009-10 the Commonwealth provided \$422.1 million in funding to the PPP.

3. What is the predicted Commonwealth expenditure for the 2010/11 financial year?

The budgeted Commonwealth expenditure for the PPP in 2010-11 is \$470.4 million.

4. How many places have been offered (with a breakdown of state and territory) in the last 12 months?

As at 31 December 2010, there were 366 000 PPP commencements, Table 1 provides a breakdown by jurisdiction:
