QLD govt supplementation

Senator Jacinta Collins: Certainly the government has been looking at the Queensland government experience to inform how we may deal with supplementation in the future. Senator ABETZ: So state governments are now going to help subsidise the national case. Senator Jacinta Collins: So it is not fair to say that the government was unaware of provider concerns with respect to the nature of the Queensland government's supplementation. Senator BOYCE: Why were you persisting with the regulation in the House? Senator ABETZ: If you were aware why were you persisting with a line to us that you were convinced that the state government had provided full supplementation? Senator Jacinta Collins: I am sorry, I have not ever expressed that position. Senator ABETZ: No, but the department and the minister's office have. Ms Paul: I am not sure that we have made that assertion either. I would like to check, so I will take that on notice, too.

Answer

The department has not asserted that the Queensland Government had provided full supplementation in relation to the Fair Work (Transitional Provisions and Consequential Amendments) Amendment Regulations 2011 (No. 1) or the Fair Work (Transitional Provisions and Consequential Amendments) Amendment Regulation 2012 (No. 1).
