Ms Taylor: The special childcare benefit is not a capped program. It is a demand driven program. Ms Paul: No. There is no link between how DHS makes its decisions and the expenditure. The expenditure just grows according to the number that are accepted. Senator BACK: Right. Also, in providing that information to me, could you also provide for me please the sort of time frames that it takes for the actual approval of a special childcare benefit.

Answer

The Department of Human Services has provided the following response.

The standard processing timeframe for Special Child Care Benefit claims is five working days from date of receipt. If a claim requires further evidence from a child care service provider to enable a decision to made, the processing time is extended until the further evidence is received by the Department.
