Senator McKENZIE: Fantastic. Could you please, on notice, provide a mapping exercise, if you like, of what is available where, because it is all fine and well, I think, to say that the service is out there, but it would be great to know where it is available. Is that possible? Ms Caldwell: And the information is also in the handbook of the range of concessional arrangements to meet families' needs. Ms Taylor: And we are happy to provide copies of the childcare handbook, if you like.

Answer

Families who have work related demands, such as shift work, can access child care arrangements that meets their needs through the different types of approved child care services (for the purposes of Child Care Benefit). Depending on a family's circumstances and the service's hours of operation this may include up to 14 periods of 24-hour care per child per year, if needed.

Eligible families using approved child care services (for the purposes of Child Care Benefit) can be paid the Child Care Benefit and/or the Child Care Rebate to assist with the cost of child care fees.
