Question

ACARA - board work program

Senator O'NEILL: Did ACARA provide any advice to the minister about the board work program that you anticipated and any impact that a decrease in funding for ACARA in the 2013-14 financial year would make? Mr Randall: Yes to the first part. Senator O'NEILL: May we have a copy of that advice? Mr Randall: I will take that on notice. Again, I go back to my answer to an earlier question. As I said, we met with the minister and talked through the work program. The second part of the questions was about this budget provision for some work that had not yet translated into our work program. So we had talked about our current work program and the provision that is there, and the funding that we have for what we are currently asked to do. That change in the budget has not impacted on the work that we have been asked to do because it was a provision for something that had yet to be formally presented to us. Senator O'NEILL: Could ask on notice, then, how the \$1.7 million saving is going to be delivered this year through ACARA, and what will be the impact of those savings in future years. Mr Randall: I will take that on notice.
