**Senator O'Neill asked on 26 February 2014, Hansard page 112**

**Question**

***Youth Connections providers***

Senator O'NEILL: How many providers were there and how many service sites under this program? Mr Cook: Nationally 67 organisations deliver Youth Connections over 113 service regions. Senator O'NEILL: Could you provide me with data breaking down that information by electorate or by postcode? Mr Cook: We could certainly take it on notice. Senator O'NEILL: Which would be the most likely that you would have, electorate or postcode? Mr Cook: We have certainly got state information. I am assuming we have got postcode information. We will certainly look into it and provide what we can. Senator O'NEILL: It would be very helpful for all of us, Senators or Members of the House, if you could provide it by electorate and for each of the years that it was running. If you could pull it out by calendar year, that would be wonderful. Also, if could we have recorded and identified the physical and postal addresses of each of the Youth Connection service sites together with the contact names, phone numbers and email addresses? Is that possible? Ms Paul: Yes. Senator O'NEILL: Is that information in the public domain? Mr Cook: The information on those 67 organisations would be publicly available. Senator O'NEILL: If you could collect that to make it available, that would be great.
