# SENATE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE - QUESTIONS ON NOTICE 2003-2004 BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING

Outcome: 2

Output Group: 2.1 – Funding for vocational education and training

DEST Question No. E028\_04

Senator Crossin tabled the following questions on 4 June 2003:

### Question:

- (i) How much was allocated in the latest budget for TAFE and does this amount take account of this increase in TAFE demand?
- (ii) What percentage increases have been made in TAFE funding over the past three years?

#### Answer:

### TAFE funding

(i) The Commonwealth provided \$1.118 billion for delivery of VET services by TAFE and non-TAFE providers under the ANTA Agreement in 2003.

The States and Territories are responsible for allocating these funds between TAFE and *non-TAFE* providers, within their jurisdictions. Neither the States and Territories or the National Centre for Vocational Education Research produces a breakdown showing the division of Commonwealth funding between TAFEs and *non-TAFE* providers.

The amount provided by the Commonwealth in 2003 takes into consideration the increase in demand for VET; and in total delivers a further \$62 million over the \$1.056 billion funding provided in 2002. It includes \$100 million plus indexation for growth in VET places (which States and Territories are required to match).

(ii) The percentage increases in Commonwealth funding for Vocational Education and Training under the ANTA Agreement over the last three years have been:

2000	\$0.931	billion		
2001	\$1.003	billion	7.7 %	increase over 2000.
2002	\$1.056	billion	5.3 %	increase over 2001.
2003	\$1.118	billion	6.0 %	increase over 2002.

As noted above, this funding is for TAFE and *non-TAFE* providers.

Under its proposal to the States and Territories for a new ANTA Agreement for the period 2004 to 2006 of May 2003, the Commonwealth has offered \$3.6 billion over three years, which represents a 12.5% rise in funding over the current 2001 to 2003 Agreement.
