Answer:

Use of AIMS vessels by other organisations

AIMS has provided the following response.

AIMS is providing 10 days of RV Lady Basten ship time per year as an in-kind contribution to an ARC funded study of Wonky Holes in the Great Barrier Reef lagoon. AIMS is a partner investigator in the project, which complements the Institute's research into groundwater discharge into estuaries. The project has a three year duration and, as the RV Lady Basten charter rate is \$5,500 per day, the total value of the AIMS' contribution is \$165,000.

Last year vacant ship time was also made available for a sea snake study by a James Cook University researcher. In this case, the charter was bare boat – 17 days at \$3,000 per day.
