Senator Carr asked on 5 June 2003, EWRE Hansard pages 531-532

Question:

The minister, in his budget press release, said that Commonwealth funding for government schools would increase by \$129 million, or 5.5 per cent.

Reconcile that figure with Budget Paper No. 1, table 7? It will be needed in terms of the reconciliation for indexation, enrolments, changes in capital and targeted programs, student assistance and other factors that might help explain the discrepancy.

Answer:

Budget Paper No 1 – reconciliation of data

Table 7, Budget Paper No. 1, has been derived by the Department of Finance and Administration and consists of administered and departmental expenses from a number of portfolios, including DEST. Further information on the sources of data in Table 7 have been provided in response to question on notice E265_04.

The \$129 million or 5.5 per cent increase in government school funding announced in the 2003-04 budget press release, reflects the year-on-year accrual increase in administered items under DEST Outcome 1. The programmes included in these figures are listed in the table at <u>Attachment A</u>, along with the item they are recorded against in Table 7, Budget Paper No. 1, where applicable.

A breakdown of the \$129 million increase in Commonwealth funding for government schools in 2003-04 is at Attachment B.
