Senator Carr provided in writing.

Question:

- a) Now the report goes on to say that [since 1996] FTE staff numbers have only increased marginally (4%) despite the revenue growth. But student numbers have grown by 33%. However, of these extra students, most are fee-paying students growth in Commonwealth-supported students has only been 6.4% is that right?
- b) Can you explain the reasons you believe underlie that set of numbers? Why have staff numbers hardly grown, but fee-paying student numbers have gone through the roof? What is the relationship between those two facts, and the modest growth in Commonwealth-funded places?

Answer

Growth in staff and student numbers

a) Growth in Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) academic staff (includes full-time, fractional full-time and actual casual staff) was 6.4% between 1996 and 2003.

Note: The FTE staff numbers have been derived using the latest available data for actual casual staff, which is 2003.

Student numbers in terms of Estimated Full-Time Student Load (EFTSU) increased by 33% between 1996 and 2003.

The EFTSU for Commonwealth-supported students increased by 6.4% between 1996 and 2003.

b) The reasons behind these numbers would need to be sourced from the universities as there will be a range of local factors contributing to them. The Australian Vice-Chancellors' Committee has recently released information on student/staff ratios, which shows that the ratio of students to staff has decreased in 2004.
