#### Question:

What projections are available for future years for doubtful HECS debt in dollar terms and as a proportion of total HECS debt?

Please provide all available estimates.

## Answer:

## Doubtful debt estimates

It should be noted that the technical calculation of doubtful debt is not necessarily a good predictor of the likely propensity of debtors to repay their HECS debt. Doubtful debt is a calculation of debt likely to remain unpaid from all loans ever created as a proportion of remaining outstanding debt, which takes account of repaid amounts. For estimating purposes, it has been assumed that doubtful debt will be a constant 28.35% of the total outstanding debt in the forward estimates period.

<sup>\*</sup> These estimates were current at the time the 2005-06 Portfolio Budget Statements were prepared. The Australian Government Actuary has since provided DEST with a preliminary doubtful debt estimate for 2004-05 of around 20% of outstanding debt. This will be reported in the DEST Annual Report for 2004-05 and will be used to update estimates in due course.

<sup>\*\*</sup> On 1 June 2006, the accumulated HECS debt will become an accumulated HELP debt.
