Question:

What communication has occurred between the Minister's office and the Vice Chancellor and/or University Management at the University of Newcastle that relates to that university's current financial difficulties since 1st July 2004? Can we have a copy of such correspondence? If not, why not?

Answer:

Correspondence between Minister and University of Newcastle re. the University's financial situation.

Between 1 July 2004 and 30 June 2005 the Minister received two letters from the Vice Chancellor of the University of Newcastle, Professor Nicholas Saunders, regarding the University's financial difficulties.

- 1. Letter from Vice-Chancellor Nicholas Saunders to Minister Nelson dated 8 March.
- 2. Letter from Vice-Chancellor Nicholas Saunders to Colin Walters (Group Manager, Higher Education Group) with a note to Minister Nelson dated 30 May.

The Minister replied to Professor Saunders on 20 July regarding the approval of the \$15 million advance to resolve the University's immediate cash flow difficulties. A copy of this is also attached.

Financial support to alleviate impending cash flow predicament at the University of Newcastle

On Friday 20th May 2005, Ms Lois Sparkes, Mr Indhi Emmanuel, and Mr Rod Mann of your Department met by telephone with Dr Sue Gould (Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Services)), Mr Piyush (Interim Chief Financial Officer) and me

The purpose of the meeting was to bring the Department up to date with the events at the University of Newcastle and to alert the Department to the failing status of available cash reserves that support our day to day operations. We indicated, that based on our projections, the University would become unable to meet its commitments as they become due in early July 2005. As a consequence we sought your Department's support in sourcing funds through the Department of Finance to a value of \$15 million, to help alleviate the problem for the period until the commercial borrowings sought to fund our restructure program can be put in place

At the teleconference we described the industrial and governance requirements with which we had to comply in order to develop a detailed restructure plan to be approved by the University Council. This plan is a critical precursor to us being able to negotiate commercial borrowings. It is the University's belief that once a firm Change Proposal has been endorsed by Council, it may take some months for us to negotiate and secure the required borrowings approvals and then receive the funds

It is for this reason that we are seeking the urgent support of your Department in assisting to secure immediate financial support of \$15 million through the Department of Finance. It is understood that funds would not become available until 1 July 2005 and would be required to be repaid prior to 30 June 2006.

I would greatly appreciate your putting in train the steps required to assist the University in this matter. Dr Gould and I would be very happy to discuss matters further with you should you wish.
