Senator Siewert asked on 31 May 2006, EWRE Hansard page 53.

Question:

Senator Siewert—Does CSIRO have an estimate of the value of this technology once it is commercialised?

Dr Steele—what would be a net present value of that estimate?

In the time period before the product is released to the market, the fees included in the license can be used as an estimate of the value of the licensed technology. On that basis, the current estimate would be AU\$1 million or more (over the lifetime of the first patent).
