Question

Indigenous Youth Leadership Program

Please provide the following information on the Indigenous Youth Mobility Program:

- a) total numbers of students participating in the program, by year
- b) total numbers of public schools and private schools acting as host schools for the program, by year
- c) total number of students at each school
- d) retention rates of students, by school
- e) amount of funding allocated per student and to each host school
- f) strategies that the managing agency, the Foundation for Young Australians, have put in place to ensure that public schools are able to participate in the program.

Answer

DEEWR has interpreted the program under consideration to be the Indigenous Youth Leadership Program (IYLP), not the Indigenous Youth Mobility Program (IYMP) and has answered accordingly.

e) amount of funding allocated per student and to each host school

The IYLP has provided an average of \$6,883 for each student at a host school to supplement ABSTUDY funds provided by the Australian Government to schools as contributions towards boarding, fees and tuition. Funding provided to schools through ABSTUDY, a means tested payment, varies dependent on the individual student and their family circumstances, and the students' accommodation arrangements.

In addition, IYLP has also made provision for a notional attribution of \$2,118 (GST excl) per semester, per student (\$4,236 per annum) for orientation, study tours and leadership development.

f) strategies that the managing agency, the Foundation for Young Australians, have put in place to ensure that public schools are able to participate in the program

Strategies adopted include:

- inclusion of the Australian Secondary Principals' Association (ASPA) in the National Reference Group to advise on engaging public schools in the program and to promote the program to public schools;
- the focus on boarding has been removed and other accommodation options including homestay are encouraged;
- guidelines for use of scholarship funds amended to better meet the needs of students at government schools; and
- non-discriminatory practices in advertising and selection processes for schools to become IYLP education providers.
