- D. Is each employee in the industry considered an industry participant?
- E. If employees are not directly surveyed, are their union representatives surveyed?
- F. If so, do they indicate satisfaction or dissatisfaction?
- G. Can you disaggregate business responses to responses from employees and unions in the industry?
- H. If so, can you provide those disaggregated outcomes to the committee?

  - e. a building association;
  - f. an officer, delegate or other representative of a building association;
  - g. an employee of a building association.

- F. Individual survey responses are confidential.
- G. Yes, to the extent that the respondents identify their industry participant category.
