## Dear Dr Batge

I refer to Questions on Notice from the 2010-11 Budget Estimates. The Department provided an answer to the Committee (EW0074\_11) which was subsequently forwarded to Senator Mason and tabled.

The response included details of the Commonwealth funding levels of non-government schools across Australia and listed schools as being located in particular electorates. Schools are attributed to electorates by virtue of a process of geocoding ie checking a latitude and longitude measurement against electoral boundary maps.

Subsequently, the Department has found that seven schools listed in the answer to EW0074\_11 were listed with incorrect electorates. I have attached an amended answer to reflect the correct electorates. The table below details the changes made to the attachments.
