Innovation and Business Industry SkillsCouncil Ltd (IBSA) is an independent, private company, limited by guarantee and run by an industry-based board of directors. IBSA's funding, as with all ISCs, is provided substantially by the Australian Government through the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR).

AllISCs are granted by the Commonwealth a non-exclusive, revocable licence to reproduce, publish, market and distribute within Australia in whatever medium, and for the term of the agreement, Training Package Endorsed Material; Training Package Support Material; and Combined Training Package Material.

The publication activities referred to by Senator Trood are funded solely by IBSA commercial arm. As these activities do not involve use of Commonwealth funds, the Department is unable to provide details of these agreements.
