Question

Upfront Payment Of HECS-HELP

 What is the demographic and/or socioeconomic profile of students who choose to pay their undergraduate HECS-HELP fee upfront rather than choosing to defer the fees to be repaid as a loan in an income contingent basis?
Of those undergraduate students who choose to pay their HECS-HELP fees upfront, how many (numerically and proportionally) are: (a) full-time undergraduate students; (b) part-time undergraduate students; (c) students from low Socio-Economic Statusbackgrounds; (d) from regional, rural and isolated areas respectively; (e) external students; (f) students who are married; and (g) mature age students.
