Question

Long Day Care Centres

Senator NASH: How many long day care centres nationally would have fewer than 30 places? Mr Kimber: I do not know whether we would have that information. Senator NASH: Would you mind taking that on notice. Mr Kimber: Usually the average is about 50 to 60. Senator NASH: Insofar as you can, could you take it on notice and perhaps try and provide that information? Could you do that on a state-by-state basis? I am interested in the comparative numbers across the states and territories. Where do the 24-hour long day care centres currently operate? Is there any consideration of having more 24-hour long day care centres?

Answer

Due to the uncapping of approved places in 2006, services are not required to report their places, therefore, the Department cannot provide this information.
