## Answer:

Halls Creek Attendance Action Group

The Department of Education, Science and Training (DEST) was represented on the Halls Creek Attendance Action Group. This Group was established in 2005 by Halls Creek District High School and the Shire of Halls Creek to keep key stakeholders informed of progress being made with the trial.

The Department of Employment and Workplace Relations (DEWR) notified DEST in mid-December 2005 about its evaluation of the Halls Creek trial and the intention to extend the trial at Halls Creek District High School in 2006.
