Dear Mr Carter

I am writing to clarify evidence given by the Australian Research Council (ARC) to the Senate Standing Committee on Employment, Workplace Relations and Education at the Supplementary Budget Estimates hearing on 1 November 2006.

In response to a question from Senator Stephens, asking whether the Minister for Education, Science and Training has not given "any assurances that she will not veto, reject or change recommendations from the ARC", I indicated that "every single application that we have recommended that the Minister approve for funding, she has agreed to approve for funding."

That statement neglected to take into account that the ARC makes recommendations to the Minister on funding at various times throughout the year and that a decision by the Minister on approval of a small number of proposals recommended for funding is pending. It is the case, however, that the Minister has not vetoed, rejected or changed any recommendations from the ARC.
