### **Question W10**

#### **Ex-Gratia Payments to the Shiels, Williams, Satatas and Hayward families**

#### **Senator Evans**

- a) What were the reasons for the Department of Defence's lack of knowledge of ministerial correspondence and ministerial telephone calls to the Shiels and Williams families?
- b) What were the Department's follow-up actions in response to Minister Hill's letter of 16 November 2005 to Slater & Gordon in which he stated that he would 'write to you again when I have further information'? Was information passed to the Minister's office in response to the Minister's commitment? When was this done?
- c) What were the Department's actions in responding to Slater & Gordon's letter of 19 May 06 to Minister Nelson? Did the Department provide advice and a suggested response for the Minister on the letter? When was this done?
- d) What were the Department's actions to follow-up Minister Billson's commitment in his letter of 18 October 2006 to the Shiels family to write 'when he has further information'? Was advice provided to the Minister? If so, when?
- e) Was the letter that Minister Billson sent to Slater & Gordon on 29 January 2007 drafted in the Department?

#### **RESPONSE**

- a), c) and d) See the Minister Assisting the Minister for Defence's statement read into evidence by Minister Coonan at the Estimates hearing on 15 February 2007 (FAD&T p78 of proof Hansard).
- b) Defence has undertaken a range of steps in seeking to identify a way to try to deal with the claims. These have included discussions within Defence with various relevant areas, inter-agency discussions and consultation, and briefings for ministers and ministerial staff.

In view of the nature of these requests, which involve the seeking of compensation for family members where there is no suggestion of economic dependency, consideration has broadened beyond the individual cases to address the range of possible implications of any resolution. These implications include significant policy issues addressing when it is desirable or appropriate to depart from compensation principles that have been established in the legal system over a long period. This has involved research regarding ex gratia payments and compensation schemes in a range of jurisdictions.

- e) Defence Legal provided an initial draft of the correspondence to the Minister Assisting's office.

**Question W22**

**DIGO facility at Bendigo**

**Senator Evans**

- a) How is the relocation of the DIGO facility at Bendigo proceeding?
- b) Are there any delays or cost overruns?

**RESPONSE**

- a) The construction work for the relocation of the DIGO facility is proceeding on schedule. The construction contract was awarded to Joss Constructions on 18 January 2007. Construction work commenced on 5 February with the removal of asbestos pipes and site clearing. On 21 February 2007, bulk earthworks commenced.
- b) No.

**Question W25**

**Defence Travel Card fraud**

**Senator Evans**

- a) What is the extent of travel card fraud uncovered so far in Defence?
- b) Is there a systemic problem with travel card arrangements in Defence?
- c) Who has carriage of the fraud investigation?
- d) Are you particularly concerned that cases of fraud have been uncovered within Defence's Inspector General Division?
- e) Might it be asked who is inspecting the inspectors?

**RESPONSE**

- a) As at 29 January 2007, there have been 123 reported cases of possible Defence Travel Card fraud since the introduction of the Defence Travel Card in June 2004. A number of these cases, however, are still under investigation and are not yet proven.
- b) No. The Defence Travel Card program successfully provides Defence with an effective and efficient way to pay for its business travel expenses. The program includes appropriate controls to ensure misuse is both mitigated against and identified and managed appropriately. Fraud cases represent only around 0.24 per cent of the \$278 million spent on the card to date and less than three in a thousand card holders. Where allegations are proven, arrangements are put in place to seek recovery of funds and to take appropriate action against the individuals involved.
- c) Reports of Defence Travel Card fraud are investigated by either the Service police or Inspector General investigators, depending on a range of factors such as the value of the possible fraud and whether the offender is a serving Australian Defence Force member or public servant.
- d) There have been no cases of travel card fraud reported involving staff in the Inspector General Division. The 17 cases of travel card fraud reported in *The Daily Telegraph* on 6 February 2007 were wrongly attributed to the Inspector General Division. The number quoted is in reality the number of investigations carried out by the Inspector General of fraud allegations against staff in other parts of the Defence organisation.
- e) In accordance with the Commonwealth Fraud Control Guidelines 2002, in the event that a member of the Inspector General's fraud investigation unit was to be suspected of criminal conduct, Defence would be required to refer the matter to the AFP for possible investigation.

***Defence Direct***

**Senator Evans**

- a) How many people are on the distribution list for *Defence Direct*?
- b) How many feedback messages have been sent in response to *Defence Direct*?
- c) How many feedback messages have been complaints about the government's policy on Iraq?
- d) What prompted Minister Nelson's change of wording in his call for feedback between the June and July editions of *Defence Direct*?
- e) What proportion of the feedback to Minister Nelson's *Defence Direct* publication has consisted of complaints from serving ADF members?
- f) What suggestions have been made for what Minister Nelson might do with *Defence Direct*?
- g) Has the Minister acted on any of the advice he has received as part of the feedback process?

**RESPONSE**

- a) 7,984 as at 1 March 2007.
- b) 104 as at 1 March 2007.
- c) Two negative messages and four positive messages as at 1 March 2007.
- d) The Minister is always looking at ways to improve the presentation of his newsletter. This small editorial change was made, firstly, because the use of both "comments" and "suggestions" was considered tautological and, secondly, the change enabled the sentence to be contained on one line.
- e) Two out of 104 as at 1 March 2007.
- f) Apart from some very positive feedback on the newsletter, the only specific suggestions about *Defence Direct* itself have been a request to increase the space available to make comments on the electronic feedback page – which has been done – and a query about the font size of the newsletter.
- g) The Minister always takes into account the views of a wide range of people when considering defence issues.

**Health Studies**

**Senator Evans**

- a) Could you please provide a list of all health studies conducted, or financed, by Defence over the last ten years?
- b) For each study what has been the purpose of the study, the outcomes of the study, the duration of the study and the cost of the study?
- c) Can we please have a hard copy of any public reports that arose from each study?

**RESPONSE**

- a) A significant number of health studies have been conducted by Defence over the last ten years. The Australian Defence Human Research Ethics Committee alone has granted ethics approval to over 270 research proposals in the last decade. This does not include studies into the management of the Defence Health Services nor other types of health studies, such as literature searches, for which ethical approval is not required. There is no central database of these other studies. There have also been several major studies into the health of ADF members and veterans conducted and funded by the Department of Veterans' Affairs. The information sought is not readily available and Defence is not able to devote the considerable time and resources required to gather this information.
- b) The information sought is not readily available and Defence is not able to devote the considerable time and resources required to gather this information.
- c) The outcomes of health studies conducted in Defence studies are frequently published in peer reviewed clinical journals which are on the public record and are readily available in specialist public libraries.

**Senator Evans**

- a) Can we please have a detailed list of the construction and work that taken place on the actual site at Bungendore since the ‘first sod’ turning ceremony was conducted on Friday 3 November 2006?
- b) Can we please have a detailed list of the work that has yet to be completed and the expected completion dates for each of these items?

**RESPONSE**

- a) Praeco Pty Ltd, a consortium comprising Leighton Contractors Pty Ltd and ABM AMRO Australian Limited, is regularly providing the status of construction and other work on the new site near Bungendore. As at 8 March 2007, the status of significant works was as follows:

- b) The building and infrastructure components of the project are being delivered as a public private partnership arrangement which requires the contractor to complete the building and infrastructure by 9 July 2008 (the target availability date). The table (in response to part a) sets out the major works components of the project.

It is in Praeco Pty Ltd's interest to meet the target availability date, because the Government's payment for services only commences following handover of the completed building and infrastructure.

After completion of the construction phase, the facility will be equipped by Defence with a comprehensive range of command, control, communications, computing and intelligence (C4I) systems. Planning for this task is well underway. ADI Limited (trading as Thales Australia) has been appointed and engaged to design, build, test and install the C4I systems required to support the headquarters. The majority of the C4I systems will be built and tested off-site prior to installation in the new facility. This installation is planned to take four months and will be completed prior to the current planned start of occupation by Defence headquarters staff in late 2008.

**SAS Historical and Research Centre**

**Senator Evans**

- a) Where will the proposed SAS Historical and Research Centre be located?
- b) On what date did the Government decide to fund the proposed SAS Historical and Research Centre?
- c) Can we please have a detailed breakdown of the \$4m that has been allocated for this centre, including what this money will be spent on and a list of committed funds over the next four years?
- d) What funding has been provided by the Government for other centres of this kind in the past – please include the date of this funding and the purpose of the centres?
- e) What funding did the Government provide to the Vietnam Veterans' National Museum in Victoria?

**RESPONSE**

- a) The SAS History and Research Centre will be located with the Special Air Service Regiment at Campbell Barracks, Swanbourne, Western Australia.
- b) Approval to fund the project from existing Defence allocations was given on 11 October 2006.
- c) The funding allocation is as follows: \$0.5m allocated for 2006-07, \$1.0m allocated for 2007-08, \$1.5m allocated for 2008-09 and \$1.0m allocated for 2009-10.

Phase 1 is intended to be opened in September 2007 coinciding with the Special Air Service Regiment 50th Birthday Celebrations and will include the refurbishment of the existing Military Instructional Building, extending the exhibition hangar, installing and fitting out two Lysaght huts and the development of a Memorial Garden.

Phase 2 will include the completion of an upgrade to the Military Instructional Building; relocation, refurbishment and reconfiguration of heritage buildings dating back to World War II, including the original SAS Company Buildings (circa 1957); and the construction of office space and work shops for restoration and preserving historical artefacts.

- d) The SAS History and Research Centre is quite unique as it is, first and foremost, a training facility. While a lot of work has been done previously on instructional facilities, memorials, or historical facilities, Defence is unaware of any other centre incorporating all three aspects. It is difficult, therefore, to compare this centre to past projects.
- e) The Vietnam Veterans' National Museum in Victoria is not run by Defence. The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) has provided the following information:

The Vietnam Veterans' Museum at Phillip Island has received four grants from programs administered by the DVA:

- October 2003 - \$30,000 towards relocation costs of the Museum's collection to the new premises on Phillip Island;

- December 1998 - \$9,149 towards a photocopier, computer, laminator, fax, modem and printer to help display exhibits in a professional manner.

**RESPONSE**

- a) Given the large number of payments over the past five years, Defence is not able to devote the considerable time and resources required to gather this information. In addition, it is likely that, in some cases, the individual claimant’s privacy may be breached if specific details for each claimant and the individual sums awarded were provided as requested. There are a further 74 cases of defective administration of which 12 are considered to be Military Justice cases being considered by the Directorate of Special financial Claims for defective administration.

<b>Psychological referrals</b>							
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- d. While the total number of referrals to psychiatrists or psychologists in Western Australia is known it is not possible using extant Defence health information management systems to determine which ADF Medical Officers made these referrals.
- e. Under current arrangements the advice of a single doctor cannot result and has not resulted in the removal of an ADF member on medical grounds.
- f. The data underpinning Defence's answer to question (c) has been manually collected and analysed by the Area Health Service – Western Australia, in response to previous investigations and ministerial submissions. However, the same data with respect to all consulting psychiatrists and psychologists in the other states is not readily available.
- g. See part g).
- h. Defence routinely uses mediation and other dispute resolution processes as a means of resolving workplace disputes and conflicts between Defence personnel. Some 37 dispute resolution processes have been centrally organised and completed in the last two years.

Mediators do not make recommendations in respect of the disputes they mediate. Mediation is a process in which parties to a dispute, with the assistance of a neutral / impartial third person (mediator / dispute resolution practitioner), identify the disputed issues, develop options, consider alternatives and endeavour to reach an agreement. The mediator has no advisory or determination role in regard to the content of the dispute or the outcome of its resolution, but may advise on or determine the process of mediation whereby resolution is attempted (based on the definition in The Australian Standard, *Guide to the Prevention, Handling and Resolution of Disputes – AS 4608, 1999*).

- i. It is not the mediator's role to broker settlements or make recommendations. It is the role of the mediator to use their expertise, experience and skill to assist parties to narrow their positions of difference to a point where resolution can be achieved.

Mediated settlements may include many outcomes in addition to or as an alternative to the payment of monetary compensation.

One means of satisfying a claim for compensation is under the Compensation for Detriment for Defective Administration (CDDA) scheme. The role of the mediator in this case would be to ensure that the claimant had every opportunity to put his/her claim. This would not be a settlement as such, as the decision rests with the CDDA delegate under the scheme.

- j. The Criss matter was a claim under the CDDA scheme. The purpose of the mediation was to assist the decision maker in making his decision on the quantum to be paid by ensuring that the claimant had every opportunity to put his claim. It was not a settlement.

It was not the role of the mediator to make recommendations on the amount or in any way to make decisions for a party or impose a solution on the parties. As reflected in the mediation agreement, the role of the mediator was to assist the parties to explore options.

Within Defence, only the Minister for Defence or a person authorised by the Minister for Defence can decide the amount of CDDA compensation to be awarded. Accordingly, all CDDA decisions in Defence are made under the authority of the Minister for Defence; it is not a delegation. In this case, Deputy Secretary Corporate Services was the authorised decision maker.

- k. i) The terms of the Deed of Release and Indemnity, which is a requirement of the CDDA guidelines issued by the Department of Finance and Administration, are that the claimant agrees not to pursue any legal action in respect of the matters for which a CDDA payment is made. Nevertheless, the guidelines recognise that a claimant may still raise their matter with the Commonwealth Ombudsman. This was reflected in the final CDDA decision in this case.
- ii) Defence did not seek any undertakings in the Deed of Release and Indemnity regarding confidentiality. That said, Defence hoped that it might be possible to agree the terms of a joint statement which might have been issued at the conclusion of the matter. As such a statement would have reflected the agreed position of the parties, Defence expected that its spirit would be honoured by both sides and it would not be the subject of alternative public statements by either Defence or AVM Criss. In the event, it was not possible to agree upon the terms of the public statement, and both Defence and AVM Criss issued separate statements.
- l. The matter has been settled through mediation. LCDR Fahy has acknowledged that the terms are a fair and reasonable resolution of her claim. The parties have agreed that there will be no further public comment in relation to the matter.
- m. See response to part m) below.
- n. On 31 October 2005, LCDR Fahy provided material in support of an appeal against termination of service on medical grounds. An extensive review was then conducted. Navy has advised on 09 February 2006 that LCDR Fahy was fit for deployment. Termination of LCDR Fahy's service on medical grounds was then discontinued. On 10 March 2006 LCDR Fahy was advised of this decision and arrangements were commenced for her to return to duty.
- o. On becoming aware of allegations of serious criminal conduct in late 2000 and after some discussion with LCDR Fahy and her parents, Defence referred the matter to the AFP for investigation on 5 April 2001.
- p. The response to W17 actually said "As at 24 February 2006, there were 406 cases involving claims for damages being managed by the Directorate of Litigation, where a demand had been made or proceedings commenced. Of these, 28 involve current and past ADF members, or surviving relatives, in claims for damages other than for personal injuries which broadly involved an aspect of 'military justice'.

As at 24 February 2006 there were 74 matters active within the Claims for Detriment from Defective Administration (CDDA) Scheme. At most 12 of these could be considered to be "military justice" claims - taking a very broad view of that term.

q. **Notes:**

1. As outlined in the response to W17 from the February 2006 Senate Legislation Committee Hearing, 28 matters involve current and past ADF members, or surviving relatives, in claims for damages other than for personal injuries which broadly involved an aspect of 'military justice'. Six of these matters involve a claim of sexual harassment.
2. This figure is as at 20 June 2006. Some cases have since been before the courts and the figure quoted will be different to other answers on this same topic where data has been extracted at a later date.

- t. Air Force has only been collecting records on the cause of deaths since early 1998.

- u. **Navy:** No disciplinary action has been taken in respect of any suicide or involuntary death in the Royal Australian Navy over the past decade. The Board of Inquiry into the Sea King accident, which occurred on 2 April 2005, is ongoing and no disciplinary action has yet been determined.

**Army:** Since the institution of the Army Sudden Death Protocols in 2004, Army has investigated every suicide or death where a service nexus exists. No disciplinary action has been taken in response to these deaths. Prior to this, suicides or death where a service nexus exists were not subjected to any specific inquiry other than those by civil authorities or by Military Police. In September 2004, the Director General Personnel – Army ordered a desk top audit of those suicides that occurred between January 2000 and July 2004, and which had not been the subject of an inquiry under the Defence (Inquiry) Regulations. This report was submitted in February 2005. It recommended that further review of seven of the audited cases of suicide be conducted. It is anticipated that the Review will be completed by late July 2006. If disciplinary action is warranted as a result of this inquiry it will be taken. There is no record of any disciplinary action being taken in response to suicide or death where a service nexus exists for the period 1996-1999.

**Air Force:** Air Force does not hold records to enable this question to be answered. Other areas within Defence may be able to assist but will most likely require extensive resources to provide an accurate response.

- v. At the completion of his Inquest into the death of Trooper Angus Lawrence on 31 Oct 2005 the Northern Territory Coroner, Mr Greg Cavanagh, made the following recommendation:

*I note and commend the pro-active measures taken by the Army in response to this death, and its fulsome apology to the family of the deceased. However, I do recommend that the Chief of Army review (once again) the position of some of those responsible for allowing the exercise to occur during which the deceased became ill. I accept the evidence of WO2 Wallace that he specifically warned higher command that exercises at the place, and at the time of year, during which the deceased became ill would lead to death. This warning was echoed to a significant extent by WO1 Lucas. I note that WO2 Wallace gave oral evidence about this warning at the Inquest, as well as in his statement which had been made quite some time before the Inquest. Nothing I heard or read suggests that this explicit warning was not given. I remain unsure that this warning was taken seriously enough or that the response was appropriate enough in the circumstances.*

As a consequence of this recommendation Army instigated a third investigation to ...inquire into and report upon statements made by Warrant Officer Wallace to the Northern Territory Coroner and to the Police following the death of Trooper Lawrence at Darwin on 10 November 2004.

The investigation was conducted by Colonel Mike Charles, the same officer who had

conducted the initial and first follow-on investigation into the death of Trooper Lawrence.

In his report dated 24 January 2006, after having interviewed WO2 Wallace, WO1 Lucas and others regarding WO2 Wallace's comments to the Northern Territory Police and Coroner, Colonel Charles concluded that

*...while someone may have made the statement claimed by WO2 Wallace that somebody would be killed, it was not explicit or clear enough to have been noted by BRIG Anstey or the majority of other personnel present at the time it was supposedly made."* Further on he states *"This enquiry has found no evidence that would cause me to change the findings and recommendations made in the earlier two reports that "no disciplinary or administrative action is warranted against any individual member of the ADF as a result of TPR Lawrence's death."*

Colonel Charles recommended that

*...no further investigation be conducted under the Defence Force Discipline Act or Defence (Inquiry) Regulations into the cause of TPR Lawrence's death.*

- w. A first inquiry into the incident, conducted by an Australia Air Force Cadet staff member, recommended that disciplinary action be taken against one member who was involved in the No 2 Wing Australia Air Force Cadet Promotion Camp. This recommendation was not made because of any finding of alleged abuse of cadets in his charge, but because the member in question had been uncooperative with the inquiry team in its conduct of the Inquiry. The member concerned subsequently made a complaint about the way the Inquiry had been conducted. This complaint was instrumental in causing a second Inquiry to be held. A second, formal inquiry was conducted by an ADF officer who found that breaches of natural justice had rendered the first Inquiry inconclusive and unsound. He also found that neither administrative nor disciplinary action was warranted against any person. Indeed, he found that everyone involved in the Promotion Camp had acted with the best of intentions albeit there had been some misplaced enthusiasm which had led to the complaints which had been made.

Australian Air Force Cadet members, whether cadets or staff, are not members of the Australian Defence Force and are, therefore, not subject to the *Defence Force Disciplinary Act*. They cannot be disciplined in a formal military sense. Under current regulations, they can only be counselled or dismissed. Revised Cadet Force Regulations, about to come into force as a consequence of Recommendations made by the Senate Inquiry into Military Justice, allow for a range of actions to be taken against Cadet Force staff members who have been found to have acted inappropriately or breached the provisions of a Code of Conduct. The range of sanctions are intended to include formal counselling, reprimands, official warnings, reduction in rank, reassignment of duties, suspension of duties and termination of services. This range of sanctions is not intended to be sequential.

- x. Of the 107 reported cases of sexual harassment the number of finalised reports has risen to 105 (as at 23 June 2006). Of these 88 were substantiated. There have been 118 actions taken in respect of these. The reason the number of actions is higher than the number of reported incidents is that some incidents have multiple respondents.

These proceedings subsequently went before the ACT Court of Appeal, which upheld the Commonwealth's claim. The application of legal professional privilege to legal advice provided by Commonwealth legal officers, including Australian Defence Force legal officers, is a matter of significance on which the law was unclear.

aa. None, since the Director of Public Prosecutions only prosecutes criminal matters in the civil jurisdiction. Following a conviction in the civil courts, the ADF may pursue the offender through the military justice system for disciplinary offences under the Defence Force Discipline Act 1982, since conduct of this kind would amount to a breach of discipline.

<b>Psychological referrals</b>							
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- d. While the total number of referrals to psychiatrists or psychologists in Western Australia is known it is not possible using extant Defence health information management systems to determine which ADF Medical Officers made these referrals.
- e. Under current arrangements the advice of a single doctor cannot result and has not resulted in the removal of an ADF member on medical grounds.
- f. The data underpinning Defence's answer to question (c) has been manually collected and analysed by the Area Health Service – Western Australia, in response to previous investigations and ministerial submissions. However, the same data with respect to all consulting psychiatrists and psychologists in the other states is not readily available.

g. See part g).

- h. Defence routinely uses mediation and other dispute resolution processes as a means of resolving workplace disputes and conflicts between Defence personnel. Some 37 dispute resolution processes have been centrally organised and completed in the last two years.

Mediators do not make recommendations in respect of the disputes they mediate. Mediation is a process in which parties to a dispute, with the assistance of a neutral / impartial third person (mediator / dispute resolution practitioner), identify the disputed issues, develop options, consider alternatives and endeavour to reach an agreement. The mediator has no advisory or determination role in regard to the content of the dispute or the outcome of its resolution, but may advise on or determine the process of mediation whereby resolution is attempted (based on the definition in The Australian Standard, *Guide to the Prevention, Handling and Resolution of Disputes – AS 4608, 1999*).

- i. It is not the mediator's role to broker settlements or make recommendations. It is the role of the mediator to use their expertise, experience and skill to assist parties to narrow their positions of difference to a point where resolution can be achieved.

Mediated settlements may include many outcomes in addition to or as an alternative to the payment of monetary compensation.

One means of satisfying a claim for compensation is under the Compensation for Detriment for Defective Administration (CDDA) scheme. The role of the mediator in this case would be to ensure that the claimant had every opportunity to put his/her claim. This would not be a settlement as such, as the decision rests with the CDDA delegate under the scheme.

- j. The Criss matter was a claim under the CDDA scheme. The purpose of the mediation was to assist the decision maker in making his decision on the quantum to be paid by ensuring that the claimant had every opportunity to put his claim. It was not a settlement.

It was not the role of the mediator to make recommendations on the amount or in any way to make decisions for a party or impose a solution on the parties. As reflected in the mediation agreement, the role of the mediator was to assist the parties to explore options.

Within Defence, only the Minister for Defence or a person authorised by the Minister for Defence can decide the amount of CDDA compensation to be awarded. Accordingly, all CDDA decisions in Defence are made under the authority of the Minister for Defence; it is not a delegation. In this case, Deputy Secretary Corporate Services was the authorised decision maker.

- k. i) The terms of the Deed of Release and Indemnity, which is a requirement of the CDDA guidelines issued by the Department of Finance and Administration, are that the claimant agrees not to pursue any legal action in respect of the matters for which a CDDA payment is made. Nevertheless, the guidelines recognise that a claimant may still raise their matter with the Commonwealth Ombudsman. This was reflected in the final CDDA decision in this case.
- ii) Defence did not seek any undertakings in the Deed of Release and Indemnity regarding confidentiality. That said, Defence hoped that it might be possible to agree the terms of a joint statement which might have been issued at the conclusion of the matter. As such a statement would have reflected the agreed position of the parties, Defence expected that its spirit would be honoured by both sides and it would not be the subject of alternative public statements by either Defence or AVM Criss. In the event, it was not possible to agree upon the terms of the public statement, and both Defence and AVM Criss issued separate statements.
- l. The matter has been settled through mediation. LCDR Fahy has acknowledged that the terms are a fair and reasonable resolution of her claim. The parties have agreed that there will be no further public comment in relation to the matter.
- m. See response to part m) below.
- n. On 31 October 2005, LCDR Fahy provided material in support of an appeal against termination of service on medical grounds. An extensive review was then conducted. Navy has advised on 09 February 2006 that LCDR Fahy was fit for deployment. Termination of LCDR Fahy's service on medical grounds was then discontinued. On 10 March 2006 LCDR Fahy was advised of this decision and arrangements were commenced for her to return to duty.
- o. On becoming aware of allegations of serious criminal conduct in late 2000 and after some discussion with LCDR Fahy and her parents, Defence referred the matter to the AFP for investigation on 5 April 2001.
- p. The response to W17 actually said "As at 24 February 2006, there were 406 cases involving claims for damages being managed by the Directorate of Litigation, where a demand had been made or proceedings commenced. Of these, 28 involve current and past ADF members, or surviving relatives, in claims for damages other than for personal injuries which broadly involved an aspect of 'military justice'.

As at 24 February 2006 there were 74 matters active within the Claims for Detriment from Defective Administration (CDDA) Scheme. At most 12 of these could be considered to be "military justice" claims - taking a very broad view of that term.

As outlined in the response to W17 from the February 2006 Senate Legislation Committee Hearing, 28 matters involve current and past ADF members, or surviving relatives, in claims for damages other than for personal injuries which broadly involved an aspect of 'military justice'. Six of these matters involve a claim of sexual harassment.

- t. Air Force has only been collecting records on the cause of deaths since early 1998.
- u. **Navy:** No disciplinary action has been taken in respect of any suicide or involuntary death in the Royal Australian Navy over the past decade. The Board of Inquiry into the Sea King accident, which occurred on 2 April 2005, is ongoing and no disciplinary action has yet been determined.  
**Army:** Since the institution of the Army Sudden Death Protocols in 2004, Army has investigated every suicide or death where a service nexus exists. No disciplinary action has been taken in response to these deaths. Prior to this, suicides or death where a service nexus exists were not subjected to any specific inquiry other than those by civil authorities or by Military Police. In September 2004, the Director General Personnel – Army ordered a desk top audit of those suicides that occurred between January 2000 and July 2004, and which had not been the subject of an inquiry under the Defence (Inquiry) Regulations. This report was submitted in February 2005. It recommended that further review of seven of the audited cases of suicide be conducted. It is anticipated that the Review will be completed by late July 2006. If disciplinary action is warranted as a result of this inquiry it will be taken. There is no record of any disciplinary action being taken in response to suicide or death where a service nexus exists for the period 1996-1999.  
**Air Force:** Air Force does not hold records to enable this question to be answered. Other areas within Defence may be able to assist but will most likely require extensive resources to provide an accurate response.
- v. At the completion of his Inquest into the death of Trooper Angus Lawrence on 31 Oct 2005 the Northern Territory Coroner, Mr Greg Cavanagh, made the following recommendation:

*I note and commend the pro-active measures taken by the Army in response to this death, and its fulsome apology to the family of the deceased. However, I do recommend that the Chief of Army review (once again) the position of some of those responsible for allowing the exercise to occur during which the deceased became ill. I accept the evidence of WO2 Wallace that he specifically warned higher command that exercises at the place, and at the time of year, during which the deceased became ill would lead to death. This warning was echoed to a significant extent by WO1 Lucas. I note that WO2 Wallace gave oral evidence about this warning at the Inquest, as well as in his statement which had been made quite some time before the Inquest. Nothing I heard or read suggests that this explicit warning was not given. I remain unsure that this warning was taken seriously enough or that the response was appropriate enough in the circumstances.*

As a consequence of this recommendation Army instigated a third investigation to ...inquire into and report upon statements made by Warrant Officer Wallace to the Northern Territory Coroner and to the Police following the death of Trooper Lawrence at Darwin on 10 November 2004.

The investigation was conducted by Colonel Mike Charles, the same officer who had

conducted the initial and first follow-on investigation into the death of Trooper Lawrence.

In his report dated 24 January 2006, after having interviewed WO2 Wallace, WO1 Lucas and others regarding WO2 Wallace's comments to the Northern Territory Police and Coroner, Colonel Charles concluded that

*...while someone may have made the statement claimed by WO2 Wallace that somebody would be killed, it was not explicit or clear enough to have been noted by BRIG Anstey or the majority of other personnel present at the time it was supposedly made.* Further on he states *"This enquiry has found no evidence that would cause me to change the findings and recommendations made in the earlier two reports that "no disciplinary or administrative action is warranted against any individual member of the ADF as a result of TPR Lawrence's death."*

Colonel Charles recommended that

*...no further investigation be conducted under the Defence Force Discipline Act or Defence (Inquiry) Regulations into the cause of TPR Lawrence's death.*

- w. A first inquiry into the incident, conducted by an Australia Air Force Cadet staff member, recommended that disciplinary action be taken against one member who was involved in the No 2 Wing Australia Air Force Cadet Promotion Camp. This recommendation was not made because of any finding of alleged abuse of cadets in his charge, but because the member in question had been uncooperative with the inquiry team in its conduct of the Inquiry. The member concerned subsequently made a complaint about the way the Inquiry had been conducted. This complaint was instrumental in causing a second Inquiry to be held. A second, formal inquiry was conducted by an ADF officer who found that breaches of natural justice had rendered the first Inquiry inconclusive and unsound. He also found that neither administrative nor disciplinary action was warranted against any person. Indeed, he found that everyone involved in the Promotion Camp had acted with the best of intentions albeit there had been some misplaced enthusiasm which had led to the complaints which had been made.

Australian Air Force Cadet members, whether cadets or staff, are not members of the Australian Defence Force and are, therefore, not subject to the *Defence Force Disciplinary Act*. They cannot be disciplined in a formal military sense. Under current regulations, they can only be counselled or dismissed. Revised Cadet Force Regulations, about to come into force as a consequence of Recommendations made by the Senate Inquiry into Military Justice, allow for a range of actions to be taken against Cadet Force staff members who have been found to have acted inappropriately or breached the provisions of a Code of Conduct. The range of sanctions are intended to include formal counselling, reprimands, official warnings, reduction in rank, reassignment of duties, suspension of duties and termination of services. This range of sanctions is not intended to be sequential.

- x. Of the 107 reported cases of sexual harassment the number of finalised reports has risen to 105 (as at 23 June 2006). Of these 88 were substantiated. There have been 118 actions taken in respect of these. The reason the number of actions is higher than the number of reported incidents is that some incidents have multiple respondents.

These proceedings subsequently went before the ACT Court of Appeal, which upheld the Commonwealth's claim. The application of legal professional privilege to legal advice provided by Commonwealth legal officers, including Australian Defence Force legal officers, is a matter of significance on which the law was unclear.

aa. None, since the Director of Public Prosecutions only prosecutes criminal matters in the civil jurisdiction. Following a conviction in the civil courts, the ADF may pursue the offender through the military justice system for disciplinary offences under the Defence Force Discipline Act 1982, since conduct of this kind would amount to a breach of discipline.

- b) Water usage is monitored locally at Defence sites and managed proactively.
- c) Water usage across the whole of Defence was in the order of 9.2 gigalitres in 2005. Figures for 2006 are not currently available.
- d) All taps, toilets and showers in new buildings and major refurbishments constructed for Defence are required to have a minimum AAA water efficiency rating or equivalent which generally includes dual flush toilets. For older Defence buildings, there is a mix of single and dual flush toilet facilities.

### **DHA RESPONSE**

- 1) Is there any requirement to provide details of how much water is used and how much water is saved in the annual reports of each department and agency in the Minister's portfolio?**

*Pursuant to the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999, DHA is, as a Commonwealth Authority, required to produce an Ecologically Sustainable Development (ESD) and environment report as part of its Annual Report. There is no specific requirement to provide details of water usage and savings.*

*DHA is progressively upgrading the range of information on environmental matters in its Annual Report taking into account the ESD Reporting Guidelines published by Environment Australia in 2003, which recommends inclusion in agencies' annual reports of the activities of the organisation that may impact on the environment, including the office use of water.*

- 2) Is water usage monitored for each department and agency in the Minister's portfolio?**

*Water usage is not monitored by DHA for the houses provided for Australian Defence Force (ADF) members. ADF members are charged a 'water fee' by the Department of Defence, which is reviewed annually and administered by the Department of Defence.*

*DHA leases, rather than owns, the offices in which it is accommodated. As such the responsibility for monitoring of and payment for water usage rests with the relevant building owner. In some jurisdictions, a component of water usage is contained within a water rates charge. Elsewhere, owners simply charge an amount to DHA under the category of 'lease outgoings'. In the main, details of usage and associated charges are not separately identified.*

*All DHA staff are encouraged to minimise water use, and the DHA Environmental Management System policy provides guidelines designed to promote responsible water usage by DHA and its staff.*

**3) What is the water usage for each department and agency in the Minister's portfolio?**

*As advised in the response to question 2, specific details of water consumption are not generally advised to DHA.*

**4) For each department and agency in the Minister's portfolio, can information be provided on whether dual flush toilets are in place in the buildings they occupy?**

*Dual flush toilets are in place in the Canberra Head Office and in most DHA Regional Offices. Those properties that do not have dual flush toilets are generally older properties where the installation of dual-flush toilets is at the discretion of the building owner in line with local authority and local government rules and regulations. DHA encourages building owners to install dual flush toilets where not already installed.*
