Dear Dr Dermody

I am writing to advise you that information regarding funding by the Australia Agency for International Development (AusAID) for a Marie Stopes International (MSI) Australia reproductive health project in Burma was inadvertently omitted from answers to questions on notice from a member of the Senate Standing Committees on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade. I apologise for these omissions and wish to correct the record.

During the Budget Estimates hearing on 2 June 2009, AusAID advised, in response to a question from Senator Boswell, that funding had been provided to MSI Australia to support activities in Burma. However in responding to two subsequent questions on notice several months later, AusAID did not include information on these activities. The error occurred as the Burma country desk misunderstood the scope of an internal request for information to report on this issue. AusAID has checked its records and confirms that this error is restricted to this one instance.

To ensure that the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade has all relevant information, a table listing AusAID funding managed by the AusAID Burma country program to MSI Australia for reproductive health in Burma is provided below:

2. In a written question on notice following the Additional Estimates of 11 February 2010 Senator Boswell asked (question 7)

In answer to a question on notice last Senate Estimates AusAID provided a breakdown by name of country and name of organisation that money is going to. Could AusAID please provide details of how much money is given to each organisation for the family planning?

I can assure members of the Committees the MSI Australia activities are fully consistent with AusAID's Family Planning Guiding Principles. The decision to provide funding reflects the poor reproductive health services available in Burma.

I would be grateful if you could forward this information to Committee members, along with my apologies for the oversight in not reporting on the MSI Australia activity.
