SENATOR MOORE asked 14/2/2006:

'Eligible tenants may be able to claim four years rent assistance arrears as well as their current entitlement.' Is that right? In itself, that is a large backdate. If that is true, can you tell us how many people are eligible for that?

Answer:

No, this is not correct. Rent Assistance is paid with the customers primary income support payment and backdated in accordance with either the *Social Security Act 1991* or the *Family Assistance Act 1999*. For customers receiving Rent Assistance with their Family Tax Benefit, their payment may be backdated for up to two financial years depending on a range of eligibility criteria. This is the largest arrears payment a customer could be eligible for.
