**Topic: Apparent multiple voters in the 2007 Federal Election**

**Hansard Page: F&PA 125**

**Senator Fifield asked:**

For that figure of 20,500 [multiple votes for the 2007 election], are you currently in a position to give a breakdown by state? Okay. That would be great. I was going to say that I would be happy just with my state of Victoria, but if you can do it for each state and for each division as well that would be terrific.

**Answer:**

The breakdown of apparent multiple voter letters sent by state and division is provided in the attached table.

Generally, a large number of apparent multiple voters are eliminated as a result of matches with apparent non-voters, that is, where it is clear that the multiple mark corresponds with an apparent non-voter. This is usually due to polling official error in crossing the wrong name off the certified list.

So far, just over 17,000 responses have been received indicating no further action is required on the basis of matches with apparent non-voters or official error, or due to inconclusive evidence.

As processing of replies is still underway, the AEC is not able to provide any more detailed information at this point.

Following the 2004 Federal Election, 64 cases of apparent multiple voting were referred to the AFP. While the AFP referred a number of cases to the Director of Public Prosecutions, no cases of multiple voting were prosecuted.
