- 2) a) e) The Department of Finance is responsible only for initiating the security clearance process with the Australian Government Security Vetting Agency (AGSVA), when staff employed under the *Members of Parliament (Staff) Act 1984* commence employment with a Minister's Office. AGSVA is responsible for the granting of security clearances as well as maintaining records on the status of security clearances granted.
- 3) The relevant Portfolio Department retains responsibility for the security clearances of all departmental employees working within a Minister's Office. In relation to the Finance portfolio, there are four departmental employees working as DLOs.
- a) NV1 (Secret) level.
- b) N/A.
- c) All DLOs in the Ministerial offices since 7 September 2013 have held appropriate security clearances for their roles.
- d) e) No.
