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Question:

Senator WONG: No, I am not actually asking about the terms. I am not asking about how much, I am asking about the legal basis of this engagement. The Commonwealth procurement rules set out a range of categories, and I am just trying to ascertain which one is being used for the purposes of this engagement.

Senator ABETZ: Well, remuneration will be consistent with the government's policy on review panels.

Senator WONG: No, I am not asking about terms. Was there a limited tender?

Ms Cross: Senator, we will check for you, but I think it was more an appropriate process than a procurement. What I can say is that the process is consistent with the way similar panels have been appointed in the past.

Senator WONG: Perhaps after the break you can come back and advise me.

Ms Cross: I do not think it was a procurement, but we will check that for you.

Senator ABETZ: These usually are not by procurement.

Senator WONG: Well, that is not actually correct.

Senator ABETZ: Yes, it is.

Senator WONG: It is not. Perhaps after the break you can come back and advise me about the basis of engagement. I am happy for you to come back on it; that is fine. We will be back after dinner.

Mr Hazlehurst: Sure, we will do that.
