Answer:

The Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (PM&C) and the offices of ministers and parliamentary secretaries in the Prime Minister's portfolio arrange many meetings. For portfolio ministers, parliamentary secretaries and their offices, some costs (e.g. catering) may be met by PM&C while other costs (e.g. travel costs) are met by the Department of Finance.

For costs that are met by PM&C, information is not recorded in a way that would readily enable these questions to be answered. To attempt to provide this level of detail would involve an unreasonable diversion of departmental resources.
