Senator ABETZ: And as I understand it—and I will correct the record if I am wrong—the Commonwealth complied with that request. Did we seek an extension or not?

Ms Kelly: No. Production continued over a number of days following the 31st. But, yes, the department has had written advice from the Australian Government Solicitor that the documents have been provided to the royal commission, but we have not communicated directly with the royal commission itself.

Senator LUDWIG: Is that advice available from the Australian Government Solicitor—that they have been communicated to the royal commission? I take it it is just an email—

Ms Kelly: I would have to take that on notice. That may well be the subject of—Senator Abetz: Yes, let us take it on notice.

Senator LUDWIG: I am happy for you to take it on notice. I do not want to breach any confidentiality.
