Question:

For all departments and agencies, please provide – in relation to all public relations, communications and media staff – the following:

- a) How many ongoing staff, the classification, the type of work they undertake and their location.
- b) How many non-ongoing staff, their classification, type of work they undertake and their location
- c) How many contractors, their classification, type of work they undertake and their location
- d) How many are graphic designers?
- e) How many are media managers?
- f) How many organise events?

Answer:

(a)(b) There are currently 7 staff in the Australian Public Service Commission (APSC) who provide communications services and public relations advice to staff. The classifications of these staff are: 1 x EL2 (Director); 1 x EL1 (Assistant Director); 5 x APS6 (3 x Graphic Designers, 1 x Webmaster and 1 x Web Advisor). All staff are ongoing and based in Canberra.

The type of work undertaken by these staff is primarily to provide advice and guidance on developing communications strategies; creative advice for developing marketing collateral suitable for hard copy and on line mediums; and occasionally, advice for public relations activities. These principally support the Commission's statutory functions through the provision of guidance, emails and publications to Australian Public Service agencies and assistance with marketing of the Commission's fee for service activities (e.g. in support of learning and development).

(c) There are no contractors currently engaged to deliver these services.
