## **Question:**

List all legal costs incurred by the department or agency since 7 September 2013 1. List the total cost for these items, broken down by source of legal advice, hours retained or taken to prepare the advice and the level of counsel used in preparing the advice, whether the advice was internal or external

2. List cost spend briefing Counsel, broken down by hours spend briefing, whether it was direct or indirect briefing, the gender ratio of Counsel, how each Counsel was engaged (departmental, ministerial)

3. How was each piece of advice procured? Detail the method of identifying legal advice

## Answer:

1. The Commission procures external legal services under the Legal Services Multi Use List (LSMUL) arrangements administered by the Attorney-General's Department.

Between 7 September 2013 and 28 February 2014 the Commission spent \$96,743 on external legal services based on invoices received and processed in that period.

External legal advice (at a cost of \$96,743) for the period 7 September 2013 to 28 February 2014 was provided by two providers: the Australian Government Solicitor and Ashurst solicitors. To attempt to provide further detail in relation to time taken to prepare the advice and the level of counsel used would involve an unreasonable diversion of Commission resources and potentially disclose information that is subject to client professional privilege.

- 2. The Commission's fees payable to counsel were under \$1500 during the relevant period. These fees were incurred in respect of one matter in which one male counsel was briefed. Counsel was engaged and briefed directly by the Commission's external legal services provider in this matter.
- 3. The Commission procures external legal services under the Legal Services Multi Use List (LSMUL) arrangements administered by the Attorney-General's Department.
