Senator RAY asked—if in terms of this list you have employed anyone else and paid them for advice – and this is payment for advice rather than printing or whatever – could you let me know who they are and how much you paid? The other is if you have recontracted or renegotiated any extension to the contract of any people on this list, could you let me know who and how much?

Answer: The department has varied contracts with the following consultants on the list:

Senator RAY asked—And how did you come by them? By way of tender or recommendation? [Vibe Australia]

Answer: It is common practice for communications consultants, media outlets and event organisers to submit sponsorship proposals to government communication sections. It is normal practice for all proposals to be assessed in accordance with Chapter 5 of the Chief Executive Instructions and against a range of criteria such as; appropriateness in relation to the communication objectives of a particular government programme. If the department considers the sponsorship positively, the proposal is submitted to the Minister for consideration/approval, as was the case with theVibe Australia's proposal. Vibe Australia's proposal was one of two accepted by the Minister Assisting the Prime Minister for the Status of Women.
