Senator Evans asked: Has the taskforce undertaken any research or produced any projections as to the level of disruption caused to the people of Sydney during Leaders' Week, for example, transport delays and closures, road blocks and so forth? Please provide details of the level of disruption anticipated during Leaders' Week. What action is planned to ensure that disruption is kept to a minimum and that people living and working in Sydney are not disadvantaged by disruptions during Leaders' Week?

Answer: APEC leaders' week in Sydney will be the largest dignitary protection event in Australia's history and inevitably there will be some disruption arising from the security arrangements that will need to be put in place with the arrival and departure of 21 world leaders for these meetings. The Taskforce is currently engaged in discussions with NSW authorities in regard to potential levels of disruption during the APEC 2007 events in Sydney. The Taskforce is unable to provide details of any proposed disruptions during Leaders' week as we are still engaging the relevant authorities.

The APEC suite of official meetings will be held across Australia in 2007 and in preparing the logistics for the meetings it is necessary for Taskforce staff to travel to all meeting cities to be able to plan the range of services that will be provided to delegates. All domestic flights are economy class whilst some Senior Executives travel Business class on long haul domestic flights in accordance with the Departments Chief Executive Instructions (CEI's). In addition some overseas reconnaissance visits have occurred.

Total cost on an accrual basis of flights, accommodation, taxis, meals and incidentals from 1 July 2005 to the end of May 2006 is \$683,000.

Total cost on an accrual basis of flights, accommodation, taxis, meals and incidentals from Taskforce inception in October 2004 to the end of June 2005 is \$58,000.
