SENATOR WONG asked on 24/05/2007:

Mr Dolan—The figure is slightly lower in the out years. I think that there was an assumption of an initial burst of some assessments in the first couple of years and then they would come down based on the estimates that I have given you of expenditure for job capacity assessment. There is not a huge difference in figures.

Senator WONG—Perhaps on notice you can just confirm what variation there might be. Do I assume then that there is an assumed average unit cost per assessment?

The following table shows the number of Job Capacity Assessments estimated to be completed from 2006-07 to 2008-09.

372,900	371,000	348,300

Estimates are based on the 2005-06 Budget and additional funding in the 2007-08 Budget. The higher number of Job Capacity Assessments in 2006-07 and 2007-08 is due to the impact of Welfare to Work reforms for transition groups of Disability Support Pension recipients from 1 July 2006, lifting of Remote Area Exemptions from 1 July 2006 and Grandfathered Parenting Payment recipients from 1 July 2007.
