Senator RYAN—I mean when the Prime Minister has come to dinner with the Governor-General at Admiralty House or Government House.

Answer:

The Governor-General has hosted the Prime Minister and other ministers for dinner or similar events on a number of occasions. On all but three occasions these events were larger official engagements, dinners or receptions at which the Prime Minister or ministers were also present (for example, Australian of the Year lunch, Pacific Friends of the Global Fund dinner, Diplomatic Corps dinner, State Lunch for the President of the Republic of Korea and State Dinner for Their Majesties The King and Queens of Spain etc). On three other occasions the Governor-General hosted the Prime Minister to a dinner meeting.
