Message from Jenny Macklin – Rudd Government Delivering for Pensioners

Pension Reforms and 2nd Round of Increases

Last year, the Government delivered significant improvements to the pension system through Secure and Sustainable Pension Reforms. The pension was substantially increased and its operation was made simpler. The reforms also make the pension sustainable into the future. On 20 March 2010, pension payments increased by \$29.20 a fortnight for single pensioners on the maximum rate and \$44.00 a fortnight for pensioner couples, combined, on the maximum rate. These new rates represent an increase in pension payments of around \$100.00 a fortnight for single pensioners and around \$74.00 a fortnight for pensioner couples, combined, as a result of the Government's pension improvements from September 2009 and indexation. Pensioner Forums Encouraged



Dear Caucus and Staff

On the share drive is a petition we suggest Caucus should circulate in their electorates that calls on the Opposition to 'Save Our Schools' and guarantee BER funding if they win the election. The aim is to have these tabled in Parliament when it next sits.

To be able to be tabled in Parliament, a principal petitioner must include their name and address on the first page of the petition. Under these rules, MPs are not permitted to be the principal petitioner or even sign a petition. However, this obviously does not exclude candidates or anyone else wishing to be a principal petitioner.
