### Date set by the committee for the return of answer: 6 July 2012

**Senator FIFIELD:** In the budget there was \$2.6 million over four years to undertake capital works to improve accessibility to Parliament House. Is this \$2.6 million to build upon work which has already been planned and has already been commenced, or is this for new works? Obviously it is new works, but is it a continuation of a current program?

**Mr Grove:** It is for new works, enhancing programs such as security disability programs which have already been completed. In a sense I suppose it is covering some areas that have been identified in the past as needing upgrading in terms of bringing the building up to a reasonable standard in relation to disability.

Senator FIFIELD: Can you quickly take me through what the works are?

**Mr Grove:** There was a much broader program for disability. There was a request for funding, which was not secured. As a consequence of that, given the limited amount of money made available, a decision had to be taken as to which things you do first in which years. ... It was principally related to public areas as opposed to private areas.

**Mr Kenny:** We can table the details, but in summary the available money will enable us to do what we have assessed as the higher priorities. Not all the work that has been identified as desirable will be able to be funded.

Senator FIFIELD: If you could table that.

Mr Kenny: Yes.

Senator FIFIELD: Thank you for that.

**Senator FIFIELD:** In terms of the works that will be undertaken, can you also provide what consultation mechanism you will have in place with the relevant stakeholders in the disability sector. **Mr Kenny:** Yes.
