There was a trial being undertaken with a particular committee inquiry, the koala inquiry, I think. I think there have been some issues in actually accessing that material when you click on the relevant link in the committee report. Are you aware of any issues there?  Mr Pye: I am not aware of the outcomes there. The Clerk or the Clerk Assistant (Committees) might be better able to answer those questions. But there are new accessibility standards which come in at the end of this year and then new accessibility standards which come in again on top of those at the end of 2014. I understand DPS was seeking some funds to enable the upgrade of the website to meet those standards. The enhancement project which is going on this year between the three parliamentary departments is also intended to work towards meeting those standards. I do know that some of the recommendations which came out of the koala population trial were going to be prohibitively expensive to put in place. So there will have to be some compromises in how that is achieved. Senator FIFIELD: Can the Clerk Assistant (Committees) add to that?  Dr Laing: Can I add to that answer, Senator? The results of the trial were considered by the chairs committee which adopted a policy of, for future cases, providing the service on request. I think the problem arises in only a very small number of submissions and it would be, as the Deputy Clerk says, prohibitively expensive to provide that service upfront for every submission to which the problem referred. But the chairs committee has decided it should be available on request. As far as I am aware, we have had no requests for any transcription. In most cases that is a sitting day of the chamber, but obviously this week senators are here for committee hearings so we would supply the three newspapers to them. Senators who hold particular offices can receive more newspapers, and that is something that the President set a number of years ago. There is a form and when senators tell my staff in Senate Services they are going to be here for whatever reason, the newspapers can be delivered. When they are not going to be here obviously it is silly to have newspapers piling up. Obviously some senators have Canberra-based staff, and I should make it clear that the newspapers are for the senators and not for the staff. That is sometimes a tricky one.  The other issue we need to look at is that, particularly for newspapers from regional areas and from capital cities that are further away such as Darwin and Perth, it takes a long time for them to get to Canberra. We struggle to deliver the Darwin paper at seven o'clock or 7.30 in the morning. With the Age and the Sydney Morning Herald it is quite straightforward. Again that is where new developments in technology might be able to help us.  Senator KROGER: What is the breakdown of entitlements to the different offices?  Mr Hallett: I am wary of using 'entitlements' because the department of finance provides entitlements to senators in their electorate offices to newspapers. If I can take that on notice I will provide a breakdown. The short answer is that I do not have the figures in front of me.  Senator KROGER: That would be very helpful.
