Question:

Currently, the Fair Work Ombudsman has proceedings on foot against Jetstar Airways Pty Ltd in relation to the employment of cadet pilots and foreign cabin crew on particular flight within Australia. While the headline activity involves DEEWR agencies, the underlying issues relate to migration law and the categorisation of flights. It appears that DIT, CASA, DEEWR, ACBPS, AQIS and DIAC have differing views on the distinction between international and domestic flights.

Is the Task Force the coordinating group for a `whole of Government' approach or is it another body or is there no such coordination?

Answer:

The Border Protection Taskforce is not coordinating a whole-of-government approach to this issue.

Coordination between relevant departments and agencies is undertaken in relation to airline issues as they emerge.

As proceedings brought by the Fair Work Ombudsman against Jetstar Airways Pty Ltd are currently before the courts, it is not appropriate to comment further on this matter.
