Answer:

- 1. For this financial year as at 28 May 2013, the National Mental Health Commission's meeting spend on official Commission meetings is \$141,624.00 (ex GST). To attempt to provide the level of detail requested for the range of other meetings that Commissioners and staff have been involved in would involve an unreasonable diversion of agency resources.
- 2. The National Mental Health Commission does not record data about Ministerial and Parliamentary Secretary meeting costs.
