What has been the department's response to the MAC report to date?

Answer:

The Finance portfolio is responsible for Commonwealth civilian superannuation. In this role, the department contributed to a series of regionally based seminars, presenting information on the superannuation aspects of the MAC report on Organisational Renewal following its release in March 2003. The department participated in the development of a package of materials responding to the MAC report, which was for agency human resource practitioners, released on 3 December 2003. The department contributed a booklet entitled "Superannuation and Mature-Aged APS Workers - Information on Retention options and Phased Retirement" to this package.

In its role as an employer, the department is focussing on issues raised in the report such as graduate recruitment and development, flexible working arrangements incorporated in Australian Workplace Agreements and family friendly initiatives.

Which issues identified in the MAC report have been identified as priority areas for the department?

Answer:

The department provides policy advice to the Commonwealth on superannuation for Commonwealth civilian employees.

In its role as an employer, the department is focussing on issues raised in the MAC report such as graduate recruitment and development, flexible working arrangements incorporated in Australian Workplace Agreements and family friendly initiatives. The department has bolstered its graduate recruitment and has introduced a new cadetship program, targetted at final year honours and Masters degree students studying economics or finance-related subjects. The department expects to have around 12 Finance cadets and around 60 graduates in 2004.

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
