- c) All members of the Community Engagement team have a role in the moderation of the Prime Minister's blogs from time to time and as required; along with their other duties.
- d) No one is specifically remunerated for undertaking moderation of the Prime Minister's blogs. Moderation of blogs, along with many other duties, is a standard task of Community Engagement team members.
