Why was there over \$2000 difference between the 2008 PM's XI dinner

and the 2009 dinner?

b) Does the Government seek tenders for all catering events? Which

companies are used?

Answer:

a) The difference in cost between the 2008 and 2009 lunches for the Prime

Minister's XI is mainly attributable to printing costs incurred in 2009 that were not

incurred the previous year, and an increase in the cost of beverages.

b) Procurement by the department is undertaken in accordance with the

Commonwealth Procurement Guidelines (CPGs) and departmental Chief Executive

Instructions (CEIs).

There are some venues used for functions arranged by the department where an

existing catering contract has already been entered into by others, and we have no

choice but to use that contractor. Parliament House and Manuka Oval during the

cricket season are two examples.

The catering contract at Manuka Oval during the cricket season is let by Cricket ACT.

That contractor caters for all events held under the auspices of Cricket ACT.

Accordingly, we used the caterer approved and appointed by Cricket ACT for both

lunches hosted by the Prime Minister at Manuka Oval.
