Answer

Yes, Newspaper subscriptions have reduced since the 2012-13 Budget Estimates with the implementation of savings measures that resulted in the number of newspapers being provided to office holders and the department being reduced.

This change resulted in savings of approximately \$23,000 annually.

The newspapers reduced were:

The Canberra Times (including weekends)

The Australian (including weekends)

The Sydney Morning Herald (including Saturday)

The Age (including weekends)

The Financial Review (including Saturday)

The Daily Telegraph (including weekends)

The Melbourne Sun (including weekends)

The Sun Herald (including weekends)

The Mercury

The Land

The cost for this financial year to date is \$12,430 (as at 31/10/12)

- 3. Has there been any change to your magazine subscriptions since the 2012-13 Budget Estimates (May 2012)
 - If yes, please provide the reason why, the cost and what magazines.
 - What is the cost for this financial year to date?

Answer

Magazine subscriptions have been reduced since the 2012-13 Budget Estimates with the implementation of savings measures that resulted in the provision of news and current affair magazines to the department being phased out.

This change resulted in savings of approximately \$280 annually.

The magazines reduced were:

Time Magazine

In addition, a subscription to *The Monthly* will cease when the current subscription term expires at the end of 2012.
