Senator Hurley asked:

Can you provide a detailed report on how the nine 21 or 33 months grants were distributed in the migrant communities and how much is the funding cost?

Answer:

Until October 2002 the grant cycle was based on the timeframe of 1 October to 30 September. In order to bring grants into line with the standard financial year cycle of July to June, all affected grants had to be reduced by 3 months respectively.
