Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 13 February 2007:

For the following financial years 2001/02, 02/03, 03/04, 04/05, 05/06 and 06/07 (to date):

- a) How many requests did the AFP receive from Centrelink relating to search and seizure powers?
- b) How many of these referrals were accepted?
- c) How many search warrants and how many arrest warrants did these referrals require?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

a) The AFP received the following number of referrals from Centrelink:

b) The following number of referrals were accepted by the AFP:

c) The AFP is unable to quantify the exact number of search warrants or arrest warrants required by these referrals. By way of explanation, of the 100 cases referred in 2006/2007, 64 cases have the case type "Search Warrant Assist". However, it can not be assumed that all of these

cases resulted in the execution of search warrants, just as some may have resulted in the execution of multiple search warrants. It should also be noted that additional search warrants may have been executed as a result of Centrelink referrals that triggered subsequent criminal investigations (undertaken by the AFP on behalf of Centrelink). Further, it is not common practice for the AFP to execute arrest warrants on behalf of Centrelink.
