Question No. 17

Senator Fielding asked the following question at the hearing on 23 February 2009:

Please provide the following statistics;

- a) the number of equal shared parental responsibility orders made in adjudicated matters,
- b) the number of equal shared parental responsibility orders made by consent,
- c) the number of equal time orders issued in adjudicated matters, and
- d) the number of equal time orders made by consent.

The answer to the Honourable Senator's question is as follows:

- a) The Family Court is unable to provide the number of equal shared parental responsibility orders made in adjudicated matters as the Court does not have this level of information available.
- b) The Family Court is unable to provide the number of equal shared parental responsibility orders made by consent as the Court does not have this level of information available.
- c) Taken from a sample of 1448¹ litigated cases² finalised in the period of 2007-2008, the Family Court made orders for 50/50³ care between parents in 15% of cases.
- d) Taken from a sample of 2719⁴ early agreement cases⁵ finalised in the period of 2007-2008, parents agreed to a 50/50⁶ care arrangement in 19% of early agreement cases. For further information in relation to shared parenting please refer to Question on Notice 15.
