Senator Fierravanti-Wells (L&CA 44) asked:

Under the Refugee and Humanitarian program, how many have <u>arrived</u> so far this financial year?

Outline the country of birth of <u>entrants</u> through the program for 2007–08 and the total so far in 2008–09?

The annual report refers to offshore visa grants by the top 10 countries of birth for 2006–07. Would you provide an update for those?

Answer.

In the period 1 July 2008 - 28 February 2009, 7300 persons have <u>arrived</u> in Australia under the Humanitarian Program.

The tables below show the main country of birth of humanitarian <u>entrants</u> in the 2007–08 program year and for the period 1 July 2008 – 28 February 2009. Children born of humanitarian applicants in countries of asylum (e.g. Thailand and Kenya) are recorded against those countries.
